FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR:

Rescue is raw and real. Sometimes it means early mornings, sometimes it means late evenings, and sometimes it means sunup to sundown! The things you see on a rescue can break you, but at the same time they drive you. Drive you to be a better person and a voice for the equine that can't speak for themselves.

Our "Go Team" spent over eleven hours on one call recently. We were ready to go at 5 a.m. We were ready to save those who needed to be saved. We had an approximate number of equine, but we were unsure on a final count. Much to our surprise, a sweet filly added to our numbers! She was about a week old and she was the highlight of our rescue because she only saw a few days of despair. She will never know what the others knew. She only knows a herd who welcomed her and a team of humans who gave her a second chance.

Every truck and every trailer we had on standby was used on this call. Six trucks, six trailers, and fourteen volunteers made a difference in these equines lives.

We have a week-old filly all the way to a 30+ year old miniature horse. All of these equine lives have been forever changed!

Update From The Barn

Introducing Rooster





Rooster is one of four horses who recently came into our barn. For some, these animals removal from their owner didn't come quick enough. What well-meaning people don't understand is there are numerous factors that have to be taken into consideration before an animal can be confiscated, and an owner charged.

If a case isn't done properly it can extend the amount of time that an animal may suffer. So please, if you have firsthand knowledge of a horse in need, start by contacting your local law enforcement and let them start the process.

1) report as quickly possible to authorities

- 2) be able and willing to give "**firsthand**" information, otherwise it is considered just hearsay.
- 3) be willing to testify, otherwise it will slow done an investigation.

4) don't spread it all over social media. This can allow an owner time to cover up any evidence, which in turn extends the animal's suffering. It can also mess up an investigation that might already be in the process.




