FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR:

It is hard to believe half of 2024 is behind us. It is also hard to believe that in this short period of time, we have brought in 55 horses in need!

All of the horses that have entered our barn over the years have been in need, but this year's rescues have been particularly difficult. We have witnessed not only horses that are malnourished, but some that have been extremely heartbreaking. Upon our arrival, we have seen horses that were barely alive, deceased horses that didn't receive help in time, and some horses that had been gored by other extremely dangerous animals on the property. These horses were left to fend for themselves by the humans that were responsible for their care. Our volunteers have stared in the eyes of horses that were left hungry, injured, and with their spirits broken as they tried to survive hour by hour, day by day. This increased intake of horses so far this year means our costs are continually rising. We have already exceeded our hay, feed, and veterinary bills for the entire year and we are only halfway through the year. The calls for rescue continue to come in. In order to continue to answer the calls of those in need, we need your help. As always, your tax-deductible donation of any amount helps provide a new beginning to each horse that enters our doors. We look forward to continuing our mission in the coming months and having you join us in those efforts!
